

## Learning: U. S. Money



### **Penny (1 Cent)**

- 5 Pennies = 1 Nickel
- 10 Pennies = 1 Dime
- 25 Pennies = 1 Quarter
- 100 Pennies = 1 Dollar

### **Counting Money**

- 7 Pennies = \_\_\_ Nickel + \_\_\_ Pennies
- 15 Pennies = \_\_\_ Dimes + \_\_\_ Pennies
- 55 Pennies = \_\_\_ Quarters + \_\_\_ Nickel
- 150 Pennies = \_\_\_ Dollar + \_\_\_ Quarters



### **Nickel (5 Cents)**

- 1 Nickel = 5 Pennies
- 2 Nickels = 1 Dime
- 5 Nickels = 1 Quarter
- 20 Nickels = 1 Dollar

### **Counting Money**

- 2 Nickels = \_\_\_ Pennies
- 3 Nickels = \_\_\_ Dime + \_\_\_ Pennies
- 7 Nickels = \_\_\_ Quarter + \_\_\_ Dimes
- 25 Nickels = \_\_\_ Dollar + \_\_\_ Nickels



### **Dime (10 Cents)**

- 1 Dime = 10 Pennies
- 1 Dime = 2 Nickels
- 5 Dimes = 2 Quarters
- 10 Dimes = 1 Dollar

### **Counting Money**

- 2 Dimes = \_\_\_ Pennies
- 3 Dimes = \_\_\_ Nickels
- 7 Dimes = \_\_\_ Quarters + \_\_\_ Dimes
- 12 Dimes = \_\_\_ Dollar + \_\_\_ Nickels



### **Quarter (25 Cents)**

- 1 Quarter = 25 Pennies
- 1 Quarter = 2 Dimes & 1 Nickel
- 2 Quarters = 50 Pennies (Cents)
- 4 Quarters = 1 Dollar

### **Counting Money**

- 3 Quarters = \_\_\_ Pennies
- 1 Quarter = \_\_\_ Dimes + \_\_\_ Nickel
- 1 Quarter = \_\_\_ Dimes + \_\_\_ Pennies
- 6 Quarters = \_\_\_ Dollar + \_\_\_ Quarters



### **Dollar**

- 1 Dollar = 100 Pennies
- 1 Dollar = 20 Nickels
- 1 Dollar = 10 Dimes
- 1 Dollar = 4 Quarters

### **Counting Money**

- 200 Pennies = \_\_\_ Dollars
- 21 Nickels = \_\_\_ Dollars + \_\_\_ Nickel
- 22 Dimes = \_\_\_ Dollars + \_\_\_ Dimes
- 10 Quarters = \_\_\_ Dollars + \_\_\_ Quarters
